COURSE INTRODUCTION

Lesson 1

The Bible says: "In the past, God spoke to our people through the prophets. He spoke at many times. He spoke in different ways. 2 But in these last days, he has spoken to us through his Son." (Hebrews 1:1-2a NIRV)

The two parts of the Bible are:

OLD TESTAMENT and **NEW TESTAMENT** (OT and NT).

The first book of Old Testament is Genesis. The word "genesis" means *beginning*. Genesis tells us about:

- 1. the beginning of the world.
- 2. the beginning of the human race (people).
- 3. the beginning of sin.
- 4. the beginning of God's promise to send a Savior for sinful people.
- 5. the beginning of the nation of Israel.

In the Old Testament, God promised to send a Savior. In the New Testament, we can read that God kept his promise. Jesus is the Savior.

The men who wrote the New Testament were **Apostles**. They were eye-witnesses to Jesus' life, His teaching, His death and rising to life again. Some Apostles became missionaries to other countries.

The first four books of the New Testament are called the **Gospels**. The word "gospel" means *good news*. The four Gospels tell us what Jesus said and did. The titles of the four Gospels are the names of the men who wrote the story about Jesus.

The fifth book in the New Testament tells how Jesus gave power to Christians to bring His Good News to the world.

Those first five books in the New Testament are the history books of the New Testament.

The next 21 books in the New Testament are letters which the Apostles wrote to other Christians. Those letters teach us important truth about Jesus. Those letters also guide use in our daily faith and life.

The last book of the New Testament gives us a vision of heaven and the future end of the world.

We have not just one history book about Jesus. We have FOUR history books about Jesus!

Each of the Gospel writers share with us his personal experience with Jesus or his eyewitness research about Him. The Holy Spirit used all four Gospel writers to teach us what God wants us to learn about Jesus.

Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John all *agree* about the life, ministry, and teachings of Jesus, while they report different events of His life.

Lesson 3 Matthew

The Bible says: "All of this took place to bring about what the Lord had said would happen. He had said through the prophet..." (Matthew 1:22)

Matthew was one of Jesus' Twelve Disciples. Matthew wrote the Gospel for the Jewish readers, to show them Jesus is Savior that God promised in the Old Testament.

Matthew does this same thing many times in his Gospel:

- Something happens to Jesus.
- Matthew says "This happened as the Lord said through the prophet..."
- Matthew quotes a verse in the Old Testament that tells what will happen to Jesus.

All through the Old Testament, God told the Jews that He will send a Savior, from the family of King David. Matthew shows us that everything God said about the Savior in the Old Testament happened as Jesus came to save us from sin and hell. Matthew's message to the Jews was: "You are looking for the Savior that God promised? Well, here He is: JESUS!"





Luke wrote ACTS as a history of the beginning of the Christian Church. The story of ACTS begins with the Ascension of Jesus and Pentecost.

Lesson 9 Persecution Spreads the Good News

The Bible says: "The believers who had been scattered preached the word everywhere they went." (Acts 8:4 NIRV)

Jesus allowed the Apostles to prove that He was Christ by giving them power to do miracles. The Jewish leaders persecuted the Christians. The persecution made the Apostles more brave to tell people about Jesus. Other Christians escaped to other cities for safety; they told people about Jesus and the Church grew.

The writer of "Hebrews" does not identify himself. We can only guess who wrote Hebrews. Names some experts guess: Paul, or one of his friends: Barnabas, Luke, or Apollos (see Acts 18:24-28). Or the writer might be none of these men.

To whom is Hebrews written?

The people who were suppose to read "Hebrews" were Jews (Hebrew people). The book is full of Old Testament quotes, and many things about Jewish religion and history. There are strong hints in the letter that the people who received this letter lived in Rome.
